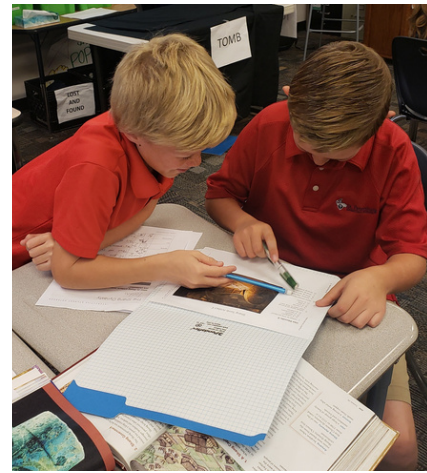

Lower Division students are learning about the Fruits of the Spirit each week during Chapel. Interactive activities are making learning so much more fun!



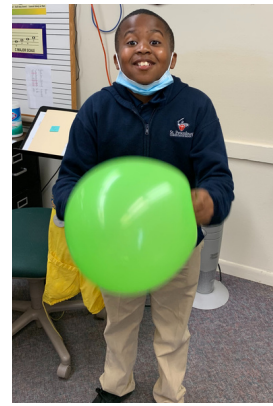
6TH GRADE SCIENCE

Sam Hunter also attended SPCS since Kindergarten and recently committed to play baseball at Queens University of Charlotte. Let's Go Royals!

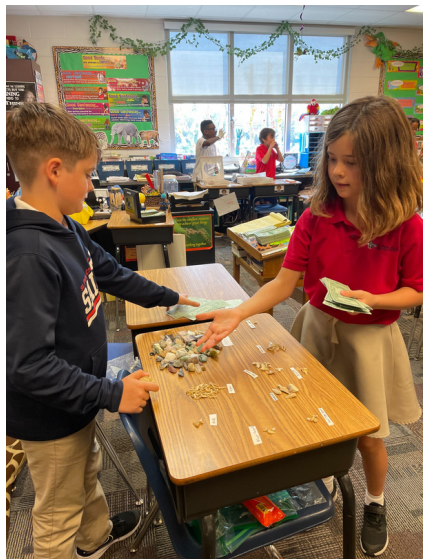

4TH GRADE ECONOMICS

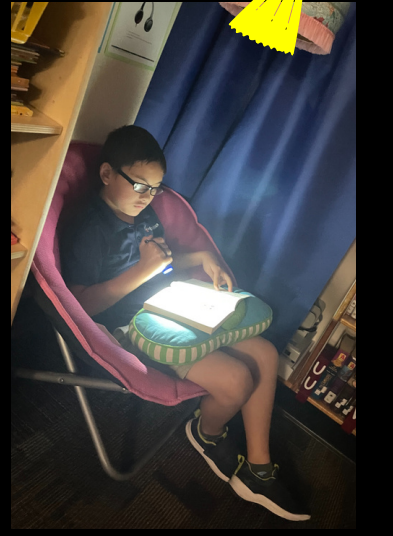
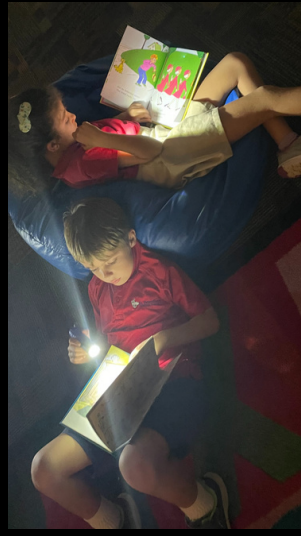
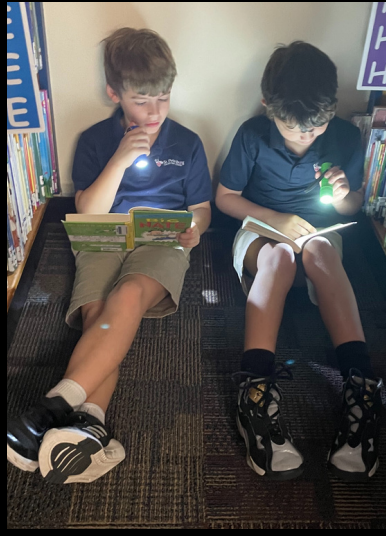

4TH GRADE VISITS THE SPONGE DOCKS

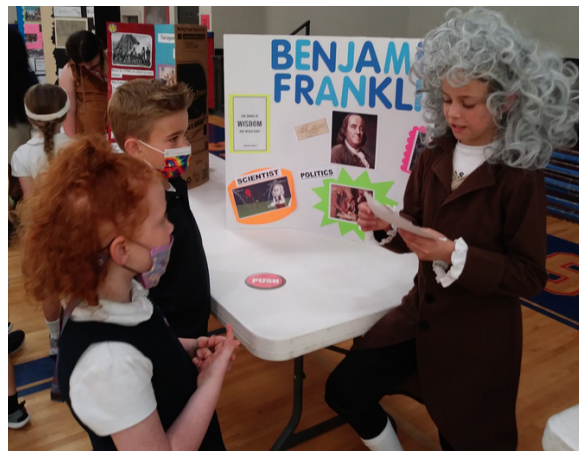

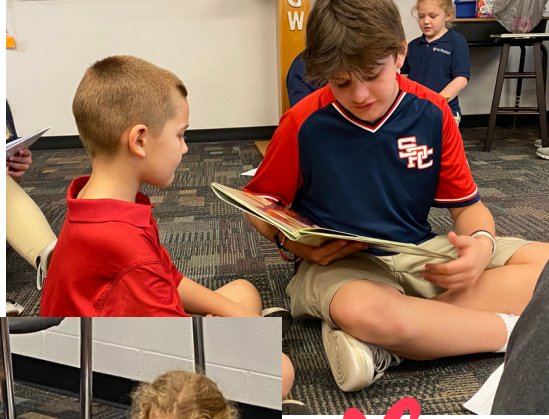
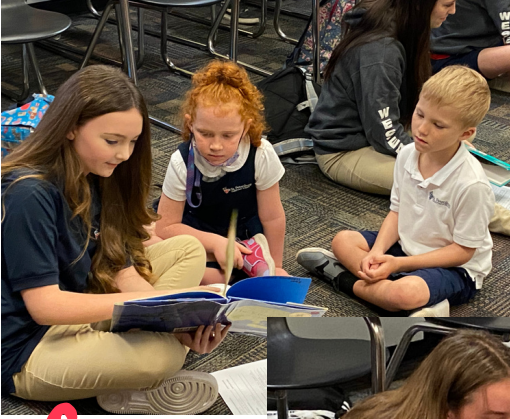
5TH GRADE STATUARY HALL PRESENTATION

Students across the grade levels learned about historical figures with the help of our 5th Grade "characters". Amazing costumes, interesting facts, and live performances made the day a success!

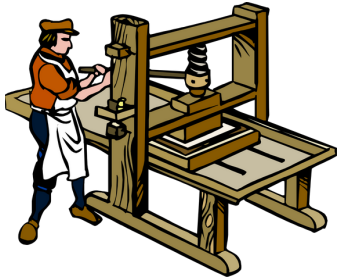


8TH GRADE AND KINDERGARTEN CONNECT

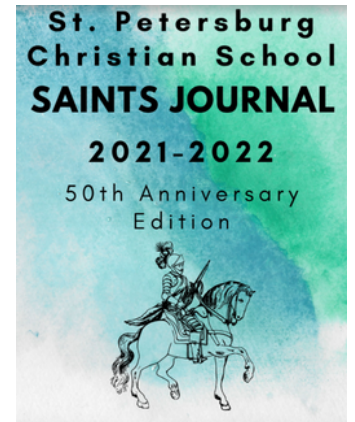

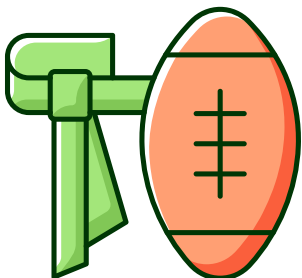
The Upper Division Journalism staff worked diligently to produce a wonderful 2022 Saints Journal publication. Job well done!

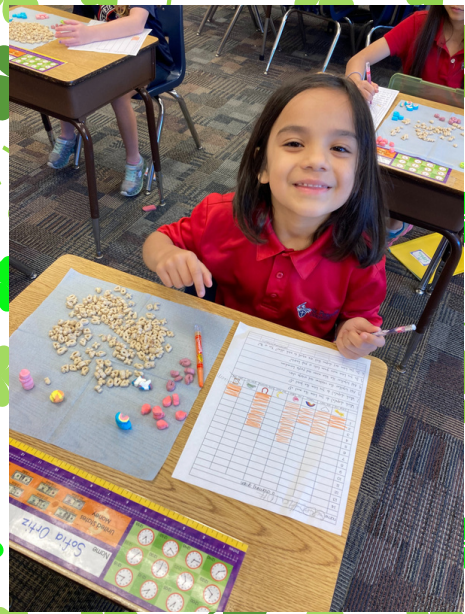
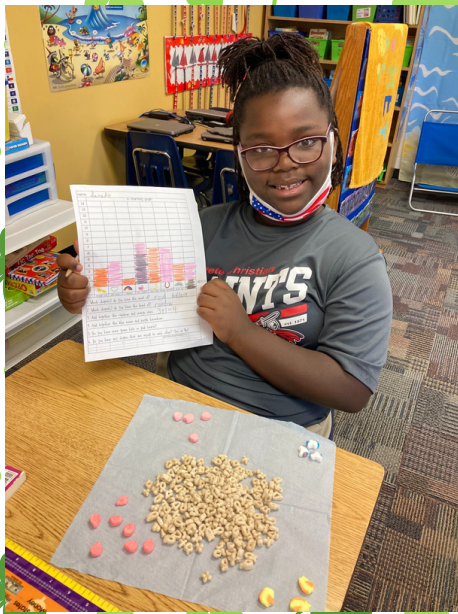
BASEBALL UPDATE



The baseball team tied Northside this week 4-4. The young team is building for great things and the older players are taking pride in mentoring and inspiring the new younger players! Great job boys!

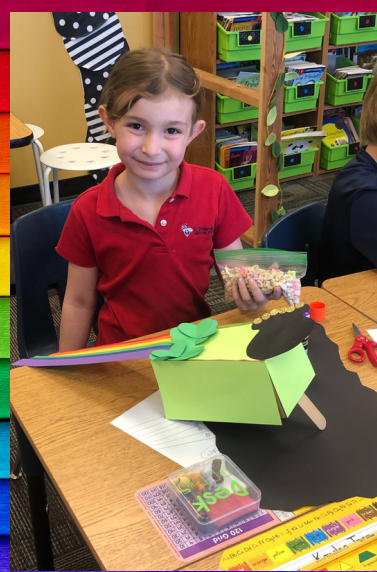
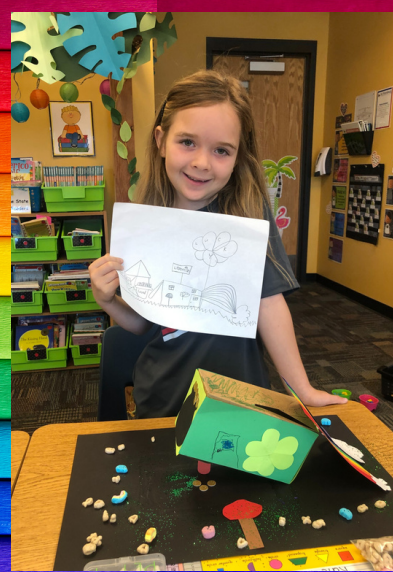
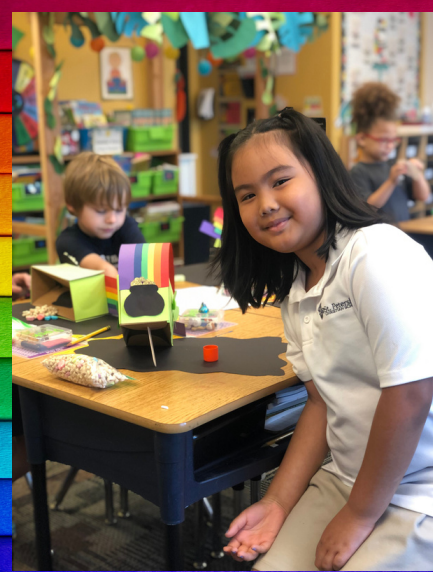
2ND GRADE MATH IS LUCKY

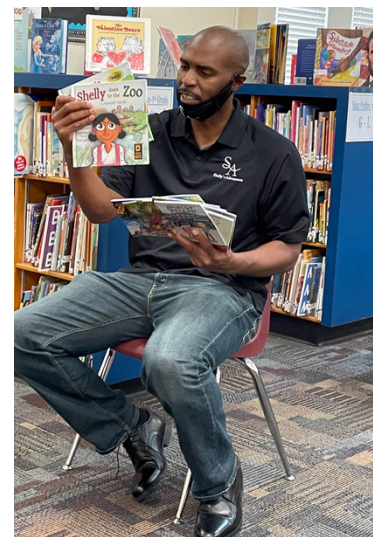
7TH GRADE BIOME PRESENTATIONS
