## 7th Grade Life Science








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## 5th Grade Debate Panel Patriots vs. Loyalists







Sixth Grade students constructed replicas of International Monuments and shared their creations, as well as facts about the monument, with their classmates. Very creative!








## 7th Grade Supreme Court Case Presentations
